The members that attended this September Dinner meeting were impressed with her presentation because of the realization that we all are faced with influencing others throughout our life time and the strategies outlined in her presentation brought to our conscious the proactive ways we can produce results that we want.

Linda explained that most people have a personal bias or filter. These were broken down in three types. Future was the bias that was looking forward and described the person that wants to make quick decisions, is goal orientated, usually enjoys change and looks to be the pioneering type. People bias is usually concerned with relationships, seeks to reach committee approved decisions, seeks out the popular choices and wishes to obtain the sense of belonging. Security bias likes to maintain the status quo, makes decisions in a through manor, normally resists change and will normally seek out the proven solutions or choices.

It is important to understand the type we exhibit as well as the type of the person we wish to influence. We should choose the right person to influence, the one who can make the decision that we are seeking. Next we must focus on a clear statement of belief and then adapt our communication to the needs of that person we are trying to influence based on their bias or filter type. It is best to be prepared for all types. People can, and do at times, change type based on group dynamics or other factors.


Follow up with commitment, those you are influencing will want this.
