
The Cable Center on the DU campus hosts January Social

1. Why are you interested in a career in accounting and what do your future plans consist of?

I began my college career as a biology major with the hopes of one day becoming a cetacean biologist (a biologist who studies whales and dolphins). However, as I got further along in my classes I realized that I didn't have a strong passion for biology, and though I may have enjoyed it for a while, the work was not something that I could see myself doing in the long run. I wanted a career with more opportunity. Knowing nothing about the field, except for the fact that it involved math, I took a chance and changed my major to accounting. I finished up a biology minor, but have been pursuing an accounting degree ever since. I have found that biology and accounting have a lot in common. Both require astute analytical and investigative skills, and both challenge me to my limits. While working towards an accounting degree I found that I have a strong passion for governmental accounting and forensic accounting.
